I Dudley Jones of the County of Franklin State of Georgia Being at this time of perfect & sound mind & memory Considering the uncertainty of life and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs whilst I have strength & capacity to do so. Do make & publish this my Last will & Testament hereby revoking & making void all former Wills by me at any time heretofore made & in the first place I commit my soul unto the hands of my Creator who gave it & my to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors herein after named & as to such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me I dispose of the same as follows That after my Death all my Debts which I may be owing be paid out of my Estate as soon as conveniently may be

I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Clarissa Two hundred & Twenty Acres of Land lying & being on Indian Creek the same including Two Tracts joining the same being more or less my household & Kitchen furniture Six Negroes viz, Sel, Tom, Abram, Mary, Kitty, Lyla one waggon & four Horses Cattle hogs with all kind of implements including blacksmiths Tools &c during her natural life also Three hundred Dollars the same to be at her disposal

I will & bequeath unto my oldest son called oswell Beall now known & called by the name of oswell Beall Jones the Sum of Two Dollars & at the Death of my wife my Will is that he the said oswell B. Jones have an equal Divident & share with the rest of my Children

I will & bequeath unto Aba A Turner the Sum of Two Dollars & at the Death of the said Aba A Turner provided his wife Patsy should be alive then & in that case she have an equal share & Divident with the rest of my Children

I will & bequeath unto James A. Hooper the sum of Six hundred Dollars the same to be paid to him by my Executors out of any property that they may deem most expedient

I will & bequeath unto each of my Children (viz) Peyton Sedney, Terrell Kitty, Louisa, Francis Jane Emily & Harriet the sum of Two Thousand Dollars

and if in case that amount cannot be made to them on my property after the Deduction of the Tuition of my Children as above stated then & in that case after the Death of my Wife the property left that was in her possession go to make up the sum Willed to them.

& it is my request that at the arrival of the age or intermarriage of any of my children as above stated that my Executors pay over to each individual of them the aforesaid sum or proportion thereof.

And lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint my Dear Wife Clara Executrix & Payton Jones of the County & State aforesaid my Executrix & Executor of this my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I the said Dudley Jones to this my last Will & Testament have hereunto set my hand & Seal on this page having before signed my name on the foregoing page the whole being contained in this paper this 31st Day of August 1823
