I Martin Dye late of the County of Franklin, and State of Georgia, being weak and sick of body, tho' of sound mind and disposing memory, & knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die - And calling to mind the Mortality of my Body - do therefore make, Constitute and appoint this my last will and Testament - revoking all others -

Item 1st It is my will that my body be Buried in decent Christian burial, and commend my soul to God who gave it, and pray him to have mercy on it

Item 2nd It is my will & desire, that my son Beckham Dye, have the sum of one dollar, to be raised out of my personal property -

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my son John Dye, the sum of one dollar - as aforesaid -

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son Martin Dye, one dollar, to be raised as aforesaid -

Item 5th I give and bequeath to Catharine Mayfield wife of Edmund Mayfield, the sum of one dollar to be raised as aforesaid -

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Jackson, wife of Abner Jackson, the sum of one dollar to be raised from and out of my personal property as aforesaid -

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my son Prettyman Dye the sum of one dollar to be raised out of my property as aforesaid -

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son Randolph Dye, the sum of one dollar to be raised out of my property as aforesaid -

Item 9th I give & bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Smith wife of Joel Smith the sum of one dollar to be received as aforesaid -

Item 10th I give & bequeath to my son Stephen Mayfield Dye, the sum of one dollar to be raised and made of my personal property as aforesaid -

Item 11th. I give & bequeath to my son George Dye, the sum of one dollar, to be raised as aforesaid.
 Item 12th. I give & bequeath to my son Benjamin Dye, the sum of one dollar, to be raised as aforesaid.
 Item 13th. It is my will that first of all, that all my just debts, be paid out of my personal estate, and after the payment of the several sums above mentioned -

Item 14th. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Catharine Dye, all my estate both real and personal, consisting of all my lands, money, Books - books of accounts, Bells, also all my household and kitchen furniture of every description whatever, also all my stock consisting of horses, cattle and hogs - &c and the implements of her bandry incident to the premises, to be hers in perpetuity, and to be held by her, possessed held and enjoyed forever, and be at disposal by will or otherwise as she may prefer

Item 15th. I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Catharine Dye, Puthorau Dye, and Randolph Dye, Executors of this my last will and testament, signed sealed & acknowledged the 24th day of Novr. 1807.
