In the name of God Amen -
I Esaias Harbour of the County of Franklin
and State of Georgia, being through the abundant
mercy & goodness of God, of a sound mind and
perfect understanding, do Constitute This to be

40 my last will and testament, and desire that it
may be received by all as such, I enjoin - I
most humbly bequeath my soul to God my maker
belieaching him of his most gracious acceptance of
it, through the all sufficient merits & mediation of
my most Compassionate Redeemer Jesus Christ, who
gave himself for me, to be an atonement for my
sins, & is able to save to the uttermost all that come
unto God, being he ever liveth to make intercession
for them, and who I trust will not reject me as
a returning penitent sinner, when I come to
him for mercy, & pardon.

I enjoin - I give my body to the Earth from whence
it was taken, in full assurance of its resur-
rection from thence at the last day -

And as touching my worldly goods, my will
and desire is that they be divided as follows -

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Salmon Harbour
thirty dollars -

Item, I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca
Kethers one negro girl named Jane -

Item, I give and bequeath to my son John Harbour
one negro man named George, also my waggon
and hind gear, also one lot of land in
Wilkinson County, sixth district & Eleventh
number - also one negro boy named Grain,
out of the value of which property, he shall
pay my son Salmon Harbour twenty five
dollars -

Item, I give & bequeath to my daughter Catherine Molder
one negro boy named Oliver, also half a lot of
land lying in old Wilkinson, second district
number hundred and forty one, also twenty
five dollars and one feather bed &
furniture

Item, I give & bequeath unto my grand son Salmon Harbour
one half of the land & premises wherein I now live, also

one negro man named Jarrett -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my grand son
Ole, Jasper Harbour one half of the land and
premises whereon I now live, also one negro
boy named Franklin, each of my said last
mentioned grand sons, shall pay one hundred
dollars, to be equally divided among their
three sisters, Sally, Catharine & Polly -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my three grand
daughters, Sally, Catharine & Polly Harbour,
one negro woman named Dikke, also my
Cotton machine, to be equally divided among the
three

Item, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally
Aderhold one negro woman named Jude,
also one negro girl named Milly -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my former son in law
Richard Hooper two dollars -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my grand son William
Hooper fifty dollars -

My will and desire is that all my other property of
every description, not bequeathed by this will, to be
~~equally divided~~ sold and enjoyed by my beloved
wife during her natural life, and after her death
to be equally divided among all my children -
and my grand son William Hooper -

Item, I leave and appoint my beloved son John Har-
bour Executor of this my last will and Testament,
which I declare to be, & every other will, deed
& lease to be void and of no effect -
