County, being sick but of sound mind & memory,
and knowing that it is once appointed for all
men to die, do make & Ordain this my last
will & Testament in manner & form following
(Viz) First & all I give & bequeath unto my beloved
Wife Frances Gooddy the tract of land containing
fifty acres more or less, bounded by Wm. Pulliam
and others, together with all and singular the Horres
Cattle, Hogs, and all other property that I have,
during her natural lifetime, and for her to
dispose of it as she may think proper at her death,
And I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Frances
Gooddy sole Executor of this my last will and
Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by
me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 8th day of September 1829
