my body to be decently buried, buried,

with & possessed, I give and bequeath & dispose
of, in the following manner -

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Archibald
Cockburn one Dollar -

One dollar -

Do, I give & bequeath to my son Abel Cockburn one dollar -

Do I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Cockburn one dollar -
Do I give & bequeath to Clark Cockburn my son one dollar -
Do I give & bequeath to my son James Cockburn & Malissa
Cockburn all the money I may possess at my death,
together with all the stock of every kind, household
and kitchen furniture, plantations, to be
divided equally ~~between~~ ^{to} them - Item, I give and
bequeath to my daughter Malissa Cockburn, my bed
and furniture that I die on, I give & bequeath to my
daughter Malissa Cockburn the negro woman Breese
and Cap by name, Breese to live together with
some good family, and if Breese should die
for Cap to take her place and work for that
unfortunate girl, and if not well done by
to be moved to some other place, or good family -
Item, I give and bequeath all my interest in the Cherokee
purchase, and two hundred and forty acres of
land more or less on the waters of Keokuk Creek
adjoining Adams & others to my son James Cockburn
and my daughter Malissa Cockburn to live on &
if sold, the money to be equally divided among
them, if these negroes should die, I wish some of her
family would do well by her poor girl - my
wish for her to live with her brother James Cockburn -
Item, I don't want for to live with her sister Sarah
Cockburn -
Item, Cap to be hired out -

Lastly, I hereby constitute
my worthy friend James H. Little, my executor
of this my last will & Testament, I hereby revoking
all other wills & Testaments made by me, therefore
I sign, acknowledge, published by the testator in presence of
of us as his last will and Testament
