

Georgia (55)th In the name of God Amen.
Franklin County & I John Holbrook of said State
and County, though sick of body, yet thanks be
to God, of perfect mind & memory, calling unto
mind the mortality of Body do make & ordain
this my last will & Testament, that is to say, pimi-
cipally & first of all, I give & recommend my
soul unto the hands of Almighty God that
gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth
to be buried in decent Christian Burial at
the discretion of my Executors, not doubting
but at the general resurrection, I shall receive
the same again by the mighty power of God,
and as touching such worldly estate wherewith
it has pleased God to bless me with in this
life - I give devise & dispose of the same
in the following manner & form -
First I give and bequeath unto my son Caleb
Holbrook all that part of my tract of land
lying on the south side of the North fork of Broad
River, supposed to contain one hundred and
twenty acres, more or less, including the plan-
tation wherupon the said Caleb Holbrook now lives
to him and his heirs forever - And I
further give to my said son Caleb all my
wearing cloaths, secondly I give to John Holbrook
son of Caleb my Triple Gun -
Thirdly I give unto Simey the daughter of Caleb
one feather bed and furniture -
Fourthly, I give & Bequeath unto my son
Jacob Holbrook all that part of my tract of
land lying on the north side, of the north
fork of Broad River - supposed to contain
one hundred and forty five acres - more or
less - being the plantation wherupon I now live
and the said Jacob now lives, to him and his
heirs forever - I further give to the said
Jacob one wool horse and harness, one

Crop cut law, all my stock of cattle, (except one
red and white cow) and also all my plantation
tools, and out of doors lumber - And I
further give to the said Jacob all my stock of
hogs. Nevertheless the said Jacob shall be bound
to give out of the above items as it is expressly
my will & desire, that is to say, unto my grand son
John Baker, son of William, ten dollars, unto John
Baker son of Benjamin ten dollars, unto John
Baker son of Elias, ten dollars, unto John Scott
- rook son of William ten dollars - and also unto
John Holbrook's son of Rachel, ten dollars - when
they and each of them arrive at mature age &
on their applications for the same. —

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Nelly Holbrook, one feather bed & furniture,
and also one other Bed, and I also confirm
unto her the stock of cattle heretofore given to
her, consisting of two cows & calves, & two yearlings.
two head of sheep, one sorrel mare, two spinning
wheels, one linen, the other cotton, one pot, one
smoothing iron, one chest, one Dutch oven,
one small kettle, together with the scraper, or shaver,
with all the saws & Earthen ware, & Coffee
mills, and one Iron kettle. Lastly I hereby
appoint my sons Jacob, and William, to be the
Executors of this my last will & Testament, having
no other will in being -
Given under my hand and seal, this fifteenth day
of August in the year of our Lord, Eighteen
hundred and four -
