In the name of God Amen, I Isaac Gray of the  
County of Franklin and State of Georgia do make  
+ declare this my last Will and Testament in manner  
and form following - First I resign my soul  
into the hands of Almighty God, hoping and believing  
in a remission of my sins by the merits + mediation  
of Jesus Christ, and my body I commit unto earth  
to be buried at the discretion of my Executor herein  
after named, and my worldly Estate I give and devise  
as follows -

First I give and devise to my eldest daughter  
Susanah the sum of one dollar, also I give  
to my eldest son John B Gray one dollar.  
Also I give to my second daughter Letty the sum  
of one dollar, also I give to my third daughter  
Mary the sum of one dollar, also I give to  
my fourth daughter Elizabeth the sum of  
one, also I give ~~next~~ to my second son  
Thomas Gray the sum of one dollar.  
Also I give to my son Garrett Gray the land  
on which he now lives called the Stonyfield

Survey - also I give to my beloved wife  
all the remainder of my property (after paying  
my Debts) during her natural life & or  
Widowhood, Also I give to my son Abner  
Gray the privilege of living on and tilling  
which I now live on untill the death or  
marriage of my wife, then to be his & his  
hirs forever. The balance of the property  
which I have given to my wife to be equally  
divided (at her death or marriage) between  
my daughter Abby, my daughter Sally -  
and my Grand daughter Sarah Scott  
And I hereby appoint my son Garrett Gray  
Executor of this my last will & Testament, in  
witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand & seal this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1831
