

Georgia Court of Ordinary
Franklin County March term 1829

It appearing to the Court, that the last will of William Pullman late of said County deceased, is lost or destroyed, and that the annexed instrument is a copy of the same Ordered by the Court that the same be read, and recorded, admitted to record as the last Will of the said William Pullman.

Recorded 6th March 1829

March the 4th 1829. In the name of God Amen
I, James Vaughan, being weak and sickly in body,
though of perfect mind and memory. do make this my
will and Testament;

Then after resigning my body to be
decently buried in the grave, and my soul to God that
gave it, and all my just debts being paid, and
as to my worldly goods, I give and bequeath as
follows (w)

Item 1st To my beloved wife Hannah P Vaughan
during her natural life, or widowhood, the
tract of land I now live on, known as a
part of a tract formerly known by Corham
Lands, together with the tract of land where
James Perkins now resides, known by the name
of the Shockley tract. together with two feather
beds and furniture, one chest, one trunk,
one pine table, four sitting chairs, one
woman's saddle, one corner cupboard,
together with cupboard furniture and all
the kitchen furniture, one cotton wheel,
and cards one iron horse Colt, one cow
and calf, three head of sheep, one small cart
and yoke of Oxen, one set of plow gear

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together with ten head of Hogs.
Item 2. To my son Ottaway W. Vaughan, I give one feather bed and furniture, one pine table, two sitting chairs, one sorrel horse colt, saddle and bridle, one sow and four pigs, four head of sheep, one heifer, one steer, one pole-lace, one mattock, one bythe, one plow and gears, one cutting knife, one broad ~~axe~~.

Item 3. To my Daughter Mariah, Vaughan, I give one bed and furniture, one Walnut Chest, one trunk, two sitting chairs, one candle stand, one cow and calf, one sow and four pigs, one breeding ewe, one pine table.

Item 4. To my Daughter Harriett Mullenbac, I give all the household and kitchen furniture on the plantation whereon she now lives - together with the cows, sheep, Hogs and two Mares - also the tract of land whereon she now lives - -

Item the 5. To my Daughter Elizabeth Ann Baker, I have given as much as makes her portion equal to the rest of my children, so that I have nothing to will to her at the present, but at the death or marriage of my wife, I will that this said Elizabeth Baker, shall have an equal part with all my Daughters -

Item the 6. I have given my Daughter Anna Fane, as much as to the rest, so that I have nothing to will to her at the present, but at the death or marriage of my wife, I will that said Anna Fane, shall have an equal part with the rest of my Daughters -

Item the 7. I have given to my Daughter Sarah Jane, as much as makes her portion equal with the rest of my children, so that I have nothing to will to her, at the present, but at the death or marriage, of my wife

my will is that said daughter be made equal
with the rest of my daughters

Item the 8th Item after the death or marriage of my wife,
I leave to my son Ottaway Vaughan the
plantation and house wherein I now live
with the different fields on the North and
North west side of the Doublehaucher, (except
the fields that Ingram Paen cleared, with
one hundred of woodling lands in a square,
including which I gave to Moriah Vaughan,
said field and house during his natural life,
then the whole of my lands to be sold and the
money to be equally divided amongst my
legal heirs -

Item the 9. All the property I now possess not designated
in this my last will at the discretion of my
Executors - I have to be sold for the benefit
of my heirs and Creditors -

Lastly I constitute and appoint
my wife Hannah F. Vaughan, Executrix of
this my last will & Testament -
