Item. To my beloved Daughter Sarah Ragsdale I give and bequeath one dollar -

Item. To my beloved daughter Rebecca Toney I give & bequeath one dollar -

Item. To my beloved daughter Rhoda William I give & bequeath one dollar -

Item. To my beloved son William Robertson I give & bequeath the whole of my estate both real and personal, that remains over and above after paying the legacies the bequests contained in this will -

Item. To my beloved son Samuel Robertson I give & bequeath one dollar -

Item. To my beloved grand daughter Jane Lucinda Robertson daughter of my beloved daughter Rhoda William, I give and bequeath one feather bed & furniture -
