do make and ordain this my last will
and Testament - First I give and bequeath
my soul to God who gave nothing
doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same by the mighty power
of God, and as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it has pleased God
to bless me with in this life, I give and
bequeath in the following manner & form
I wish my Body to be buried in a
decent Christian manner at the discretion
of my Executors and my Estate both
real and personal of which I am
at this time possessed or that is in any
way my lawful right - I will and
direct that the same be divided dispo-
-sed of and applied in the manner
and form following to wit -
First, I give and bequeath to my daughter
Elizabeth Hollbrook, the house in which
I now live and fifty acres of land
around the same -
I give and bequeath to my son John D
Hollbrook, to be paid by my Executors out
of my estate five dollars and no more
having heretofore given him his proportion
equal to what I now give the balance
of my being -
It is my will that the balance of my

Estate both real and personal be sold and
equally divided between the balance of my
Children giving first to my daughter Franky
Mulleum Children one Childs part of my
Estate to be divided equally amongst them
by my Executor, to wit, my son in Law Wm
Howell my daughter Elizabeth Holbrook, my
son in Law John Arnold - my son
in Law John Hendricks, my son Pleasant
Holbrook, my son in Law George Robert
Sawth I hereby appoint my beloved son
Pleasant Holbrook, my Executor of this
my last will and Testament, thereby
revoking and making void all other
former wills by me made -
