soon as my son George arrives to the age
twenty one years. It is to be remembered that
some time past give my son Walker
two negroes (Tomb) Smart and Nym, together
with some land, all which is to be considered
in part of this dividend of my estate, I
also request that my loving wife Mary
my friend Larkin Cleveland, be Executor
of this my last will and testament, who I
think, I acknowledge this to be my last will
and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this thirteenth day
of June Anno dom. one thousand seven hundred
and eighty nine
