Georgia Whereas I John J. Pulliam of the County of Franklin County & State aforesaid, being in my perfect senses, do think proper to make this my last will & Testament First of all I desire that my Funeral expenses shall be paid, and secondly that all my Just debts shall be paid Thirdly, that my sister Emma Pulliam shall have my negro woman by the name of Grace, but my will and wish is for my Mother to have the use of my said negro woman as long as she should live, and then my sister Emma to have her the said negro woman Grace, and my will and wish is further that if my aforesaid sister Emma should die before she should inherit the right of the said negro woman Grace, then the said negro to be and belong to my next youngest sister to wit Elizabeth Pulliam, and fourthly my will is that my sister Elizabeth Pulliam should have my young Grey Horse, and one bed & furniture, And Fifthly that my youngest sister Emma should have my other bed & furniture and my young Grey Colt, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty

+ declare this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following - First I resign my soul
into the hands of Almighty God, hoping and believing
in a remission of my sins by the merits + mediation
of Jesus Christ, and my body I commit to the earth
to be buried at the discretion of my Executor herein
after named, and my worldly Estate I give and devise
as follows -

First: I give and devise to my eldest daughter
Susannah the sum of one dollar, also I give
to my eldest son John B. Gray one dollar.
Also I give to my second daughter Letty the sum
of one dollar, also I give to my third daughter
Mary the sum of one dollar, also I give to
my fourth daughter Elizabeth the sum of
one, also I give ~~also~~ to my second son
Thomas Gray the sum of one dollar.
Also I give to my son Garrett Gray the land
on which he now lives called the Honeyphus
