 at the time of my death, except March, willed
 to my daughter Arminda, Also all my Horses

 whatever, that I may be possessed of at the
 time of my death

5th I will and bequeath to my much esteemed friend
 and son Dr Solomon Weatherly, all my surgical
 instruments, medicine, professional Books, and
 Shop furniture

 the property I have willed and bequeathed
