

In the name of God Amen
 I, Joseph McEntur being in health and of
 sound mind and memory, but knowing
 that I am appointed for all men once to die
 do make ordain and declare this to be my
 last will and Testament overbidding all others,
 First, I request all my Just debts shall be punctu-
 ally paid. Second, I give and bequeath unto my
 beloved wife Nancy McEntur, the plantation
 whereon I now live, together with all my estate
 both real and personal during her natural
 life or widowhood, giving to each of the
 Children as they may marry or leave her what-
 ever in her judgment she can spare without
 embarrassing the estate or injury to the rest.
 Third the property to be valued by three dis-
 interested men, which valuation to be recorded
 to make all equal.

Fourth after the decease of my wife, and all
 the Children having been made equal in
 the first valuation, the rest and residue
 of my estate both real and personal, to be
 equally divided between my Eight Children
 (viz) Minerva C McEntur, James L McEntur
 John H McEntur, Robert H McEntur, Elizabeth
 A McEntur, Joseph W McEntur, Martha C
 McEntur and Nancy J McEntur.

Fifth I appoint my beloved wife Nancy McEntur
 Executrix and James L McEntur and John
 H Little Executors of this my last will and
 Testament, with my particular request request
 that they will see it punctually complied with
 in every part. In testimony whereof I the said
 Joseph McEntur have hereunto set my hand & affixed
 my seal this 28th day of May 1834.
