

Georgia Franklin County April 25th 1832

In the name of God Amen Lewis Chandler being in perfect health and perfect memory, and in mind the morality of the body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make & ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, principally & first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent order at the discretion of my friends, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God bless me with in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner & form, first I give to the Children of, my first wife (viz) Luanna, Chandler, my negro woman Sarah & her future increase if any, I also give to my wife Polly Chandler and to the lawful heirs of her body my negroes to wit, Hannah Queen & Gilford, and their future increase if any, after the above named property is taken from my estate as above named, the balance of my property viz, all my lands & Tenements, house hold & kitchen furniture, plantation tools, all my negro property not named above, my stock of horses, cattle, hogs & sheep to be equally divided between my wife Polly Chandler & all my Children, any thing I should give away in my lifetime, shall be deducted of their share, I appoint Martin Anthony and French Hagar to execute my will ratifying this and no other to be my last will and Testament, annulling all for my wills or bequests by me made, in witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand & fixed my seal the day & year first above written

of all, I give & recommend my soul unto the hand
of Almighty God that gave it & my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial
at the discretion of my executrix, nothing doubting
but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of Gods, and
as touching such worldly estate wherewith is has
pleased God to bless me in this life, I give do give,
& dispose of the same in the following manner & form,
I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my dearly
beloved wife & Zelena my daughter and ord that
my wife goes with if it lives. Eighty acres of land
