 said branch on Grov River. To my dear
 and loving wife Betty, I bequeath one third
 part of the remainder of all my real and
 personal Estate so long as she shall live,
 the remaining to be equally divided among
 my Children, as likewise is her part at her
 decease, and I do appoint and request John
 Franklin & also, Wilcox as Executors to this
 my last will & Testament in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal this the
 19th day of July in the year of our Lord
 1803.
