of perfect memory, thanks be to God for the same,
to calling to mind the frailty & uncertainty of human
life, have made, Ordained, constituted & appoint-
ed & by this presence do make, ordain, consti-
tute & appoint this to be my last will & testament,
hereby revoking all other will or wills by me here-
before made, declaring this only to be my last will
and testament, in manner & form following (Viz)
First I give & bequeath my soul to God my great
Creator, hoping through the mediation of ^{Jesus} Christ
to receive Remission of my sins, my body I leave
to be decently buried at the discretion of my Chil-
dren, And as to what worldly things it hath pleased
God to bestow on me, I give & bequeath in the
following manner (Viz) I give & bequeath to my
Daughter Mary Carter my negro woman named
Tal. I give & bequeath to my Son William Walter
Walton son Liza, a negro girl named Rhoda -
I give & bequeath to my Son stillis Walton all my
part of this present crop, also my part of a
legacy left to us by Henry Mullens of Virginia Decd
to pay off certain debts, and if there should be
any left after the debts are discharged to be
divided as other of my property, also to have
a fifth part of the following property, A negro
man named Roger - a negro man named
Tom - a negro boy named Sturgis, also a
fifth part of my part of the land I now live on,
also a fifth part of a mare and two colts, also
a third part of all my cattle including what
my son George has had, also half of my house-
hold furniture, I give and bequeath to my son
William Walter, a fifth part of the above
mentioned negroes, Lands & Horses, also I give &

bequeath to my son George a fifth part of the
 above mentioned negroy Lands & Horrs; also a
 third part of all my cattle, also I give &
 bequeath to my daughter Rachel a fifth part
 of all my estate, also half of all my household
 furniture - I do hereby acknowledge this to
 be my last will & Testament, hereby revoking and
 disannulling all other wills by me heretofore
 made, & hereby declaring this to be my last will
 & Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand, & affixed my seal this eighteenth day
 of November in the year of our Lord one
 thousand Eight hundred and of the ~~Independence~~
