arising from the sale of the said cotton, &
the balance to be converted to the use of my
said daughter. And lastly I hereby appoint
Jann Swore, Joseph Chandler Esqr. William
Calloway, Frances Calloway, and the reverend
John Cleveland to be the Executors of this my
last will & testament. In the testimony of the
above and foregoing writing to be my last will
and testament, I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this third day of January Eighteen hun-
-dred and six -

I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Eliza-
-beth Molder, one good feather bed & furniture,
also one cow and calf, together with forty
dollar worth of household furniture -
Item, I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah
Molder one good feather bed & furniture,
also one cow and calf together with sixty-
-five dollars in furniture - Item, I desire
that my three last named children Jacob
Elizabeth, & Sarah, Molder be taught to
read & write out of my estate, - Item, my
will and desire after the marriage or death
of my wife, for my land to return with all
the remaining goods & chattels to be sold, &
equally divided among my Children, (viz)
Abraham, Molder, Mary Mitchell, Lewis

Molder, Catharine Stutchell, Anne Stutchell
 Daniel Molder, Jacob Molder, Elizabeth Molder
 and Sarah Molder, and do hereby ^{appoint} my
 loving wife Catharine Molder + many ^{competent} son in law,
