I, Alonzo H. Payne Senior, of the State of Georgia and County of Franklin, being old and considerably infirm in body, but of sound mind & disposing memory, Calling to mind the mortality of my body, & knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament - That is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of Executors - And as touching my interest in the present Lottery, if it should be my fortune to draw either Gold or land or both, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner & form, First it is my will and desire, if I should be fortunate drawer in the present Lottery, that there should be an equal distribution of the same amongst my seven Children or their representatives in the following manner - To my eldest son Massfield H. Payne one seventh part, to my eldest daughter Elizabeth Payne one seventh part, to my son Thomas Payne one seventh part, to my third son
