I Edward Price of the State of Georgia
Franklin County - being very sick, weak in body,
but of perfect mind & memory, thanks be given
unto God, Calling unto mind the mortality of
my body & knowing that it is appointed for
all men one to die, do make & ordain this
my last will & Testament (that is to say) Prin-
cipally and first of all I give and renounce
my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that
gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth
to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at
the direction of my Executors - Sarah Price
and Tills Wallow, nothing doubting but at
the general Resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty Power of God -
And as touching such worldly Estate where with
it pleased God to bless me in this life, I
give, demise & dispose of the same in the fol-
lowing manner, and first, I give and bequeath
to Sarah my dearly beloved wife, the upper
half of my land that I now live upon, with
all the ~~Household~~ goods & farming utensils
& all my carpenters tools & cooper tools, also all
my horses, cattle, sheep & hogs - to be her prop-
erty so long as she remains my widow also

I give to my beloved son Blaborn Rice, one
 Sniper & my wearing Cloaths, & my Gun & shot bag,
 & one axe, one Hoe & one mattock, also I give
 my beloved son Leonard Rice the lower part or
 half of my aforesaid land, and a yearling horse colt,
 and a likely two year old Sniper, & his axe, mattock
 & also I give my beloved son William Rice one
 yearling Sniper, and the roan filly colt - that she is
 now with foal with - & the upper half of my land
 with the aforesaid utensils, to be his, whenever my wife
 Sarah discontinues to be my widow. Also I give
 my beloved daughter Polly Rice, a likely two year
 old Sniper and a chance of a colt that is in the
 Matthews Mare - Also I give my dearly beloved
 daughter Elizabeth Rice one three year old
 Sniper, & the land is not to be divided until
 William is twenty years of age, also my beloved
 son Willij Rice, is to be supported by all the others
 or else take their property by law. For his support
 And I do hereby utterly revoke, and disannul all
 & every other ~~former~~ Testament, wills, Legacies, requests,
 & bequests by me in any ways before named, willed,
 & requested, Ratifying & confirming this and no
 other to be my last will & Testament, in witness where-
 of I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23rd
 day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen
 Hundred and One
