 my body I Recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent
 and christian like manner

And as regards to such worldly Estate
 as it hath pleased god to bless me with in this life I Give
 and dispose of in the following manner and form to wit
 This is my last will & testament after all my just debts
 are paid I Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
 during her natural life or widowhood after my death
 the tract of Land whereon I now live one horse & plow
 & Gear one yoke of Oxen and cart two milch cows household
 & kitchen furniture & Corn and meat enough to support
 the family for the present year five of the best Hogs
 and one cock & five head of Sheep & five sheeps and
 at her death all to be sold and the proceeds Equally divided
 amongst all my Children to wit John Freeman Sarah
 Chandler Henry Minick William Freeman James Freeman
 Richarda Freeman Elizabeth Hardyman James Freeman
 Nathaniel H Freeman and the balance of my property
 which I have not disposed of in this will to be sold
 as soon as convenient and the proceeds equally divided
 among my above named children Except that Richd
 Freeman Receive nothing until all the Rest of the
 Children Receive fifty dollars apiece each to make
 up for the fifty that he Richard has Received I hereby
 appoint my son John Freeman my lawful Executor
 of this my last will & testament and to carry the
 same into Execution In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & seal this 18th day of July 1841
