desirous by the permission of almighty God, to
make and ordain this my last will & Testament.
First & foremost of all things here below I recom-
-mend and commit my soul & body into the
hands of almighty God who gave them me,
and hoping at the day of the Resurrection
to receive it again, & that my body be buried
in a christian like burial, all my real & personal
burial Expenses to be discharged I then I
give & bequeath to my beloved wife Susan Robert-
-son & equal part with my children during
her widowhood - I give to my daughter Eliza-
-beth Robertson, Margaret Robertson, Sarah

Robertson, ³⁵ Rebecca Robertson, Rhoda
 Robertson, William Robertson & Samuel Robertson
 my two sons an equal part of all my estate
 both real & personal, with all my household
 furniture, and all my property, Real and
 personal be valued by three individuals men
 and then as my loving Children become of age
 give to each of them their portions agreeable
 to the valuation of my property, and if
 any property should increase, still to be val-
 -ued & Equal distribution - Item, the second -
 my will is that Benjamin shall enjoy the land
 he now lives on provided he pays the expenses -
 I have been at within three months, Item the third,
 I do Ordain establish and appoint Saml Robert-
 -son my Executor, Jeph Armstrong & Abner Franklin
 my Executors, to carry into full force and execution, then
 my last will and testament, in testimony whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 23 day
 of March 1803 -
