corn, meat & Fodder, My house  Kitchen Furniture, and  
if any on the place not mentio  to be aded. which is  
to be for the education and raising of my  children untill  
they become of age, and then I give my beloved wife Reddy  
Hemphill one third of my Estate and the balance of my Estate  
it is my wish and desire that there will be and equal division  
to be made between my five children. And that my beloved wife  
Retty Hemphill and Charles D. Jenkins is to act as Executors

of the above will Given under my hand this 12<sup>th</sup> of March 1828.
