In the name of God Amen I Robert Langbridge
of the State of Georgia & County of Franklin
being weak in body but of perfect mind &
memory Knowing that it is appointed by Almighty
God for all Men to die in order therefore that I
may be as far as in my power be prepared for that
awful but most certain Change which will
close my transactions with all transitory & worldly
Concerns In the name of God make solemn
this my Last will & Testament In hopes of
Mercy from the Almighty God for Christ's
Sake Recommending my Soul to him from
whom I receive it & my Body to the earth to be
decently Buried in a Christianlike manner at the
discretion of my Executors And as to my
Worldly Estate I Will & bequeath in the following
manner (To wit)

First I will bequeath unto my beloved wife
Susannah Langbridge the one fifth part of my
Personal Estate Except my negro man Tom
which part so bequeathed to my wife after her decease
to be equally divided between my Daughters
Fanny & Susannah Langbridge Secondly I
will unto my son Samuel Langbridge the
Sum of one Dollar Thirdly I will unto my son
Jacob Langbridge the sum of one Dollar Fourthly
I will unto my son James Langbridge the sum of
one Dollar Fifthly I will unto my Daughter
Polly Hancock the sum of one Dollar
Sixthly I will unto my son Robert Langbridge
one hundred & fourteen Acres of Land being
the place whereon Allen Jones formerly Lived
Also all that part of the tract of Land that I now
live on that lies on the North side of Eastman's
Creek as low as to the Rocky Branch

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Seventhly I will unto my son John Laughridge & my son Benjamin Laughridge the Tract of Land whereon I now Live Except the part willed to Robert Laughridge to be equally divided between the said two sons John & Benjamin Laughridge in Quantity & Quality also one other tract of Land containing one hundred & thirty Acres being the place whereon William Scott formerly lived to be divided as above & to each of the the said fifth part of my personal Estate Except my negro man Tom. Eighthly I will unto my Daughter Fanny Laughridge the one fifth part of my personal Estate Except my Negro Man Tom which is to be for the use & under the Control of my wife Susannah Laughridge until her Death making Fanny & Susannah Laughridge Equally Interested with my said wife in the service of Negro Tom in my wife's life time & after my wife's Death to belong to my two Daughters Fanny & Susannah Laughridge. Ninthly I will unto my Daughter Susannah the one fifth part of my personal Estate Except my Negro Man Tom which is to belong to Fanny & Susannah Laughridge after my wife's Death as above stated & if either of my said Daughters Fanny & Susannah should die without any lawful heirs then & in that case the other is to own my Negro Tom after the Death of my wife Susannah Laughridge & Tenthly I will unto my son William Laughridge one set of Blacksmith's Tools

Eleventh I do hereby appoint my truly & beloved Friend Richard Gray & William Kuchel Executors of this my Last Will & Testament Revoking & disannulling all former Will or Wills heretofore by me made & I do hereby make & ordain this my Last Will & Testament. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this fifth day of June in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & Eighteen
