ty of my body that it is appointed for
all men once to die and being of sound
and disposing mind do make & ordain
this my last will & testament Principal
and first of all I recommend my soul
unto god that gave it and my body
to the earth in a christian burial manner not
doubting but at the General resurrection I
shall recover the same again by the might
Power of god and as touching such worldly
as it hath pleased god to bless me with I give
and dispose of the same in the following man-
ner and form (viz)

1st I recommend the payment of all my just
debts

2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Mary McKee the plantation where on I now
live during her natural life and then
pass to my son Andrew A McKee
I also give to my wife the following

negroes namely James Lethy Amy Isaac
Joicey quantin & James D. Jacob & Penny
the whole of my stock of Horses cattle
hogs & sheep all my house hold and a kitchen
furniture and plantation tools for her use
and benefit during her natural life.

3^d I give and bequeth to my Daughter
Rosannah a negrowoman nancy now in
her possession

4th I give and bequeth to my daughter
Jane a negro woman sinda and her
child Elizabeth now in her possession

5th I give and bequeth to my daughter
Mary a negro girl Mary

6th I ^{have} give and bequeth ~~into~~ to my son
William to Mc Kee a negro girl. dinah
which he has received

7th I ^{have} give and bequeth to my daughter
Rachel a negro girl Manerva which
she has received also a negro girl Emily

8th I give and bequeth to my son Thomas
a negro girl Lucrecia which he has
received also a girl Sarah

9th I give and bequeth to my son John
a negro boy green which he has received
also a girl Milly

10th I give and bequeth to my son Samuel
a negro girl susannah which he has
received also a boy William

11th I give and bequeth to my daughter
Martha a negro girl Fanny which she
has received

12th I give and bequeth to my son Andrew
a negro boy marion & a girl
Milly & a boy Augustus

13th I give and bequeth to my sons
Thomado John Samuel & Andrew A

- two lots of land one in the Eleventh District Carroll County No 210 the other situated in the fourth district just section formerly Cherokee County No 1041
- 14th I give and bequeath to my ^{Grand} daughter Mary R. M. Allen one Feather bed bedstead and furniture
- 15th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary one Feather bed bedstead & furniture
- 16th I give and bequeath to my son and He one Feather bed bedstead & furniture
- 17th I give and bequeath to my grand children (viz) the Lawful heirs of my daughter Martha Allen a negro girl Carolin to be under the contrall and direction of my Executors to be used and disposed of as my Exrs may think best for the benefit of said grand children
- 18th It is my desire that the negroes left to my beloved wife during her natural life and their increase if ~~there~~ be any put in lots and Equally divided between all my children except my daughter Martha Allen which I wish to go to her children and to be under the direction of my Exrs
- 19th It is also my wish for my stock of Horses cattle hogs & sheep & house hold and kitchen furniture and other effects not disposed of by this will to be sold after the death of my beloved wife and be equally divided between ^{all my children} except Martha Allen which is to go her children by the direction of my Exrs as before directed

20 and Lastly I constitute and
 appoint Thomas McKee and Andre
 McKee Executors to this my last
 will and testament hereby revoking
 all former wills given under my
 hand and seal this 29th Apr 1845
