in possession. I also give and bequeath to my Daugh-
ter Mary the other half of the Land we now live on
Also one hundred Dollars to be paid in notes or money
I also give and bequeath unto my oldest son

A Tract of Land to be Sold off as follows
beginning at the lower part of the ground he now
occupies, thence a straight line within Bounds of the
S. E. Corner of his field on to line by the
School house Branch. I also give to my son
James a Piece of Land joining Jones & Burton
a part which I got of Jones
I also give and bequeath to my son John
half of the Tract of Land in Elbert County
containing Four hundred Acres more or less
joining Lands of Edmund Lowery
I also give and bequeath to my son Nicholas
the Land we now live on beginning on the River
at a Water Corner, thence on said line to Egyptian-
grass Pasture, thence to the Creek to be the line to
Burtons line. Also I give to my son Nicholas
a note on Wm & Christopher Baker to the amount
of Seventy three Dollars. Also Fifty two Dollars in
Note. I also give and bequeath to my Daughter
Rebecka a Tract of Land containing two

above what is mentioned above to my beloved wife
Christian half of the Lands in Elbert County &
the Gray horse we are now in possession of. Also
I appoint her my beloved wife Christian Executor
with James & John Executors to manage and
dispose of all my perishable property notes and
accounts as they may think best to the use of
