

In the name of God Amen, I John Shipley of the State of Georgia and County of Franklin, being of perfect memory and sound understanding, do make, constitute and appoint, this my last will and testament in form and manner as follows to-wit: In the first place I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and my body to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors, in hopes of a happy immortality, when the streams of time shall be absorbed in the abyss of eternity, secondly that my lawfull debts be discharged in such manner as may appear most for the advantage of the heirs respectively - Thirdly, I bequeath to my beloved wife Martha fifty five dollars with her bed and furniture, and all her personal cloathing forever, likewise the half of the profit arising from the rent of the plantation - three cows, six hogs, and the use of the dwelling house during widowhood, Fourthly, I bequeath to my two sons and four daughters namely, William and George, Nancy, Naomi, Elizabeth and Polly, all my real and personal estate, to be equally divided among them severally as they arrive to years of maturity - Fifthly, all and every thing relative to the estate, not particularized in this will; and all kind of business relative thereto, my executor is to transact in such manner as he shall judge most for the advantage of the whole of the heirs, and I do hereby authorize and appoint Robert Shipley Esq. and Nathaniel Shipley, as my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament, given under my hand and seal this 23rd day of Novr. 1799
