this my last Will and Testament (Viz)

I bequeath
to Thomas Farmer of said County, all the personal
property, promissory notes, Bonds &c. of which I
may die possessed, in Consideration of services
rendered me by said Thomas Farmer while living.
And it is further my will that the said Thomas Farmer,
out of the said personal property, & Notes, &c. so
bequeathed to him, shall pay to Thomas J Farmer
John A Farmer, Nancy Farmer, and Susannah
Farmer, Children of the said Thomas Farmer - the
sum of Twenty five Dollars each, as soon after
my decease as they shall come of age, or be
may deem prudent -
