manner (I turn) I give and bequeath to my
loving wife Mary all my household furniture
the balance of my estate I request to be equally
divided between my wife and my children, as
soon as my son George arrives to the age of
twenty one years, It is to be remembered that I did
some time past give my son Walker Watton
two negroes (Tomit) Smart and Tyne, together
with some land, all which is to be considered
in part of this dividend of my estate, I do
also request that my loving wife Mary and
my friend Parkin Cleveland, be Executor of
this my last will and testament, involving all
others, I acknowledge this to be my last will and
testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this thirteenth day of
June Anno dom. one thousand seven hundred
and eighty nine
