I Isaac Edwards being of sound mind & disposing memory, this week in Body, do make, Constitute & Ordain this my last will and Testament revoking all others - In the first place, I leave the sum of five hundred dollars to Hannah Baits as pr. Note, to be raised, out of my estate, and all the property that she is possessed of, in her own right in my possessions - and also the profits arising from the mill till Christmas, and one spotted bay horse known by the name of Sawney, and five hundred weight of pork, Secondly I leave to my son William Edwards one negro boy by the name of Fendle, - Thirdly It is my will that all my estate both Real and personal be sold on a twelve months Credit, and all my just debts to be paid out of the money arising therefrom, & the balance of the money thus arising be equally divided between all my Children. Fourthly I do hereby appoint my son Wm Edwards & Joseph Edwards my Executors to this my last will & Testament. hereby ratifying ~~providing~~ they may do in that behalf.

I, George W. Williamson of the County of Franklin Georgia, being very sick  
and weak in body, and of perfect mind and  
memory, thanks be given unto God, calling  
unto mind the mortality of my body, & know-  
ing that it is appointed for all men once  
to die, do make & ordain this my last-  
Will & Testament, that is to say, principally &  
first of all, I give & recommend my soul  
unto the hands of Almighty God that gave  
it & my body I recommend to the earth  
to be buried in decent Christian burial, at  
the discretion of my Executor, nothing do-  
ing but at the general resurrection I  
shall receive the same again by the mighty  
power of God - and as touching such  
worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased  
God to bless me in this life, I give devise  
and dispose of the same in the following  
manner and form  
I do give & bequeath to my two youngest  
brothers, William and Richard Whitaker all  
my property to be divided between them  
equally: (viz) two horses and two head

of cattle, and <sup>(12)</sup>all my accoutrements  
I do likewise constitute make & to have  
John Echols the sole Executor of this my  
last will & Testament, I do hereby utterly  
disallow, revoke and disannul all &  
every other former Testaments, wills, Legacies  
bequeathments, & Executors by me in any wise  
before named, revoked and bequeathed,  
ratifying & confirming this and no  
other to be my last Will & Testament in  
witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand & seal this twenty seventh  
day of June in the year of our Lord  
one thousand Eight hundred & twelve  
Signed, sealed, published  
pronounced & declared by  
The said William Wheeler as  
his last will & Testament  
in the presence of us who  
in his presence & in the presence  
of each other have subscribed
