do make and publish this to be my last will and
testament, First I commend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God who gave it and my body to the
discretion of my Executors, to be buried in a decent
manner at the expense of my estate, and as touching
worldly things I bequeath it unto him whom I have pleased God to

step on with, I dispose of in the following man-
ner, that is to say (first) I give & bequeath to my
beloved wife Elizabeth Williamson all my real
estate to be disposed of as she may think proper
I also give her four negroes, Court Frank, Sam,
Lucy & Rachel, I also give her all my stock of
cattle, horses, hog and sheep & goats, together with
my household furniture & plantation tools &c. I
also give to my son Robert Williamson one negro
boy named Walker, I also give to my son Richard
Williamson one negro boy named Lewis, I also
give to my daughter Elizabeth, wife of Richard Allen
one negro girl named Selvy, I also give to my
daughter Betty wife of Josiah Priethitt five dollars
I give to Thomas Sorham one negro boy named Ruben
I also give to my daughter Summitt Handy the
sum of five dollars, I also give to my daughter Mary
wife of William Hardy one negro girl named Mary
one horse, mare, one feather bed & furniture, I also
give to my daughter Harry Williamson one negro
woman named Hannah, I also give to my daugh-
ter Nancy a negro girl named Cloi, I also give
to my daughter Sally one negro girl named Clappa
I also give to my son Peter ^{Griffin} Williamson a negro boy
named Jack, I also give to my son John one
negro boy named Stirling, I also give him three
hundred dollars to be raised out of my estate, I
appoint and leave my wife Elizabeth Williamson
whole and sole Executor of this my last will and
Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal the 4th day of
June 1798 -
