Item 3^d. It is my will that all my just debts
be paid out of my personal estate -
Item 4th. It is my will that after the pay=
ment of my debts that the balance of my
estate be under the control of my Executors,
both real and personal, to be appropriated
and disposed of for the use and benefit of

maintain and of my beloved wife Peggy and
my Children, to be by them appropriated
as they may think most to the advantage
of my wife and Children —
Item 5th. At the death of my wife or
at her marriage, I wish that in the event
of the former, all my personal estate be equally
divided between my Daughters (Wiz) Elizabeth
Willis, Lucinda Willis, Charity Willis, Partheny
Willis, and in event of the one (In testis) being
a Daughter to have all my personal estate
equally, either by choice and lot, or by sale and
division of the money as may at that time
be thought most to their advantage —
And in the event of the intermarriage of
my wife, that she have her thirds and share
of my estate both real and personal, ac-
cording to the custom, Law & usage of this State,
and that the remaining two thirds of my
personal Estate be divided between my
Daughters as aforesaid —

Item 6th. It is my will that my son William
Willis have all my real estate at the death
of my beloved wife, or at her intermarriage,
so soon as he shall have arrived at the
age of twenty one years, unless in the event
of the child with which my wife is now
pregnant, being a son it is my will that
he have an equal share with my son
William Willis, however it is my will that
the profits of my land be appropriated and
applied to raising & maintaining one of my
wife and Children until my son or
sons shall have arrived at the age of
twenty one years of age —

Item 7th. I do constitute my beloved wife
Peggy Willis and Thomas Payne my Executor
of this my last will and testament.
