I William Bush of the County of Franklin & State
of Georgia being mindful of my mortality do
this the first day of May Eighteen hundred
and thirty nine make and publish this my
last will and Testament in the manner
following: First desire to be decently buried with
as little expense as may be - I give and
bequeath to my beloved wife Lucy Bush all
of my negroes, Harry, Dick, Lewis, Ben, Jasper,
Peppe, Norton, Hagar, Flora, Fanny, Julia, Martha
Arthur, and Sarah my youngest child, and all
~~of household and kitchen furniture~~^{of Horses},
Hogg, and cattle, sheep and all of the household
and kitchen furniture, and to have the land
where I now live during her lifetime or
widowhood - I also will and bequeath
to my daughter Louisa Jones a negro girl
Lininda, and at the death or widowhood
of my wife the balance of my negroes to
be equally divided between my three
children - I also will and bequeath my
land where I now live to my son William
F Bush after the death of my wife or
widowhood, I also appoint William R
Wilborn, William F Bush, & Lucy Bush
my executors & executrix of this my last
will and Testament, hereby revoking all
former wills and Testaments wheresoever by
me at any time made - In testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal the day & year above written
signed sealed published & declared by the said testator as
for his last will & Testament in the presence of us who at W. Bush *[initials]*
his request in his presence have subscribed our names,

GEORGIA & I Stephen Phillips of said State
Franklin County and County being low in health,
out of sound mind and despoiling memory, and
calling to mind that it is once appointed for man
to die and after that the Judgment, do make
and ordain and constitute this as my last
will and Testament - As regards my soul
I resign it to God my Creator, and my
body I resign it to its mother dust. And
as for the little property it has pleased
God to bless me with, I give and bequeath
it as follows - My land wherewithal now
live consisting of two hundred acres, and
also my forty acre lot by me drawn in
the County of Cobb, one score horses
and all my stock of cattle, sheep & hogs,
also the house hold and kitchen furniture,
all of which after paying all my just debts
