I William Golly Senior of Pickens District South Carolina being weak of Body, but of sound mind & memory, Calling to mind the Mortality of the body, do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament, in the manner & form following

Item 1st It is my will that all my property of every kind of which I die possessed of sold at public sale, that a credit of twelve months be given

Item 2. That after all my Just debts is paid, the residue or remainder of the money arising from the sale as aforesaid, be divided in the manner and form following, among my Children, that is to say, to my son James Golly, his son and son in Law, one seventh part to be equally divided between those three, To my son Joseph Gollys one seventh part, To my daughter Patsy Hammett to her son and daughter one seventh part to be equally divided - To my son William Golly one seventh part, deducting twenty five dollars which he owes me - To my son Jesse Golly one seventh part deducting from the said Childs part one hundred dollars, which I give to Eleanor Sanders - To my son Massary Golly one seventh part - To my son John Golly one seventh part - Having given my lands to my son William Golly, and to my son John Gollys son the above property consists of negroes and other goods & Chattels

Item 3. I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son William Golly sole executor to this my last will, disannulling all former wills, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this sixth

day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & twenty nine in presence of
