

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Pulliam, the whole of my Estate both real and personal, of every discription, to be enjoyed by her during her lifetime, and to be disposed of by her at death as she may think proper. (Excepting what is here after otherwise disposed of)

do 2 I give and bequeath unto my sister in law Elizabeth Lee, the one half of a lot number three hundred and fifteen in the twentieth district of Muscogee County. Also one sorrel mare, which is now in her possession, together with one half of my stock of cattle, which she is to receive at the decease of my beloved wife Sarah Pulliam.

do 3 I give and bequeath unto John Pulliam my Wagon and one horse, which he is to receive after the death of my beloved wife Sarah Pulliam.

do 4 I give and bequeath unto Thomas King one Negro man named, Hubbard, which he is to receive after the death of my beloved wife Sarah Pulliam.

And lastly I do hereby Constitute and appoint Thomas King my sole Executor, to Execute this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal this 30th Day of June 1828.
