Polly Pikes Nancy C Wilson Rachael H Holbrook John H Holbrook
Jesse C Holbrook & James P Holbrook

5th My desire is that all my just debts & liabilities of my effects

6th My desire & wish is that my blood wife Cincinnati Holbrook have
an equal part share of my property with my children die my wife
to have her last & furniture. Also my three single daughters to wit
Elizabeth Terrissa & Rachael to have each their last & furniture

7th I wish all my daughters married & single to have twenty five
dollars each for their own equal with what I gave to my sons
when they left me

8th All that portion of my estate when divided that goes to my daughters
married or single to be paid out to them their heirs or assigns

9th My wish and desire is that my blood wife Cincinnati be single give
to her when together if then ever we ~~are~~ agreeable an agreement
made among them to live in harmony together but if my property is
sold at the highest bidders they cannot divide such amount of my
chattel & my wife Cincinnati choose in what order she will
& make her own arrangements she should have it for

10th My wish for this is that my estate should be settled with my wife
children & should be a regular part of this my will & testament
in deed

11th Finally my wish is that my beloved son John H Holbrook be
my executor to carry out my desire in the distribution of
my estate after my decease

 is my last will and testament that I contain here in part
 of land lying in the State of Mississippi and County of Collier
 Native Township twenty three (23) North of Bridge No 1
 lying east lying and being in the County of St. Charles
 To be sold next the proceeds to be applied in the following
 manner I wish to be legally bound and after paying
 my funeral expenses I wish the balance to be applied to paying
 all my just debts and that I bequeath to Mrs E. J. Cooley one
 hundred dollars extra of the sale for her kind attention to
 me during my sickness I further wish if there is any of the
 proceeds of the sale of the above lands of to pay all my
 debts that is to say in part to my sister Jane Morrison I be-
 queath my friend John Bouglin to carry out this my last
 request
