hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

First I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian
like manner at the back side of Mr. Gillett Meetinghouse the
old Church and to be done without any superfluous show my
soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope
for Eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ whose religion I have professed and as I heartily
trust enjoyed the long Major part of my life

Second I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Savita
all the land that I am possessed of with all the house hold and
furniture with one good farm horse her sons to be given
steers hogs and other meat with a sufficient quantity of necessary
tools also a negro man by the name of Henry about forty
years of age and five hundred and fifty dollars in money
all of which is to be held and enjoyed by my wife during
her natural lifetime and at her death to be divided among
all my children so as to make them all equal
third I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
and Margaret & each the sum of One Thousand dollars and
fourth I give and bequeath to my son Peter P. Smith one thousand
hundred and eighty dollars in addition to what I have already
given him

Fifth I give and bequeath to my son George L Smith Four
hundred dollars in addition to what I have already given him
Sixth I give and bequeath to my son Ethan L Smith two hundred
and one hundred dollars to be paid her at the death of my wife less
if there should remain any sum in of the two hundred dollars
given at the death of the said Peter P. Smith it is to go to
the child she may be leaving sixth

Seventh I wish that my grand Policy & Insurance via this my
wife during her lifetime and at the death of my wife to Ethan
Smith of my plantation the said Ethan will with it also give her
two hundred dollars to be paid her at the death of my wife less
if there should remain any sum in of the two hundred dollars
given at the death of the said Peter P. Smith it is to go to
the child she may be leaving sixth

Eighth whereas I have given my two single daughters in the 3rd clause of this
my Will a certain sum of money this further my wish that Isabella
C and Margaret et cetera each a good feather Bed & furniture
Ninth Whereas the most of my effects in Cash notes then all my
Executor fail to collect and pay for him & there should not be enough
to pay all the forties off each of my legatees bear the loss
