I Meredith Collier of the County and State of said being sound in mind though feeble in body and knowing that it is appointed unto man once to die and of being it to be my duty to make disposition of the property which a kind providence has blessed me with do make publick and declare this to be my last will and Testament

1st It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a decent Christian like manner my soul I surrender up to God (who save it trusting that it shall live in immortal glory)

2nd It is my will & desire that all my just debts be paid out of the money that may be left on hand at my death

3rd I Give and bequeath to my beloved son George W Collier one Feather Bed & common bedding & bedstead and one Cow and calf

4th I Give and bequeath to my beloved son Andrew J Collier my horse Selun one Feather Bed & Bedding & Bedstead one Cow & calf one Sow and Pigs and one Rifle Gun

5th I give and bequeath to my beloved son Meredith Collier one Bed & Bedding & Bedstead one Cow & calf one Sow and pigs & one shot Gun

6th I Give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary Elizabeth Collier daughter of James M Collier one Feather bed & bedding & one bedstead

7th I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Collier during her natural life and at her death to be sold and the proceeds Equally divided amongst all the children the following property to wit a lot of a Negro man and his wife Mary and her child Catharine and within a year about sixteen years old Two Oxen (White ones) Two Good Cows & Cries one good horse & one wagon one Carry Bag Cart all my iron tools & kitchen furniture what had in before disposal of Cotton Gin Gin Sawing Machine and four set of blacksmiths tools harnessing the horse Cattle Cart and Pigs Fatting hog trough for one year one year provisions and a life estate in the lands and their appurtenances that I have purchased for Andrew J Collier and in which I have reserved to my wife a life Estate also Two sea Sticks

8th It is my will and desire that the residue of my Estate to wit Lands & Negroes and what is sold at Publick sale my also that my State bonds be sold at the same time & place and that the proceeds arising from such sale as well as the money on hand at my death (after paying my just debts) and the money that may be due me in the State to be Equally divided & amongst all my legates

9 I hereby constitute nominate and appoint my son John

Where as I Meredith Collier of said County did on the
Twentyfifth day of June Eighteen hundred and fifty three
make publish and declare my last will and testament and
had the same attested by Solomon H. Pace Henry Goby and
Perry Johnson and where as I am desirous of changing certain

portions of said will do make publish and declare the
following as a Codicil to said last will and testament.
It is my will and desire that the fifth item of said will
be and the same is hereby revoked as the property thereby given
has already been given to my (now deceased) son Meredith
Collier Jr.

It is my will and desire that the seventh and eighth items
of said original will be and the same is hereby revoked insofar
as the distributional of my deceased son Meredith Collier Jr
only is concerned he having already received more than a full
share of property from me

I hereby will and bequeath to my now son Henry Collier
the only child of my deceased son Meredith Collier Jr one hundred
dollars in cash to be paid his legally constituted executors
one year after my death Item 11 I hereby constitute Martin
and appoint my son G. W. Collier one of my executors in this
my last will and testament in the event and stead of my
Collier hereby appointed
