 and County being of sound
 age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this
 world leave with right and proper bequest to myself
 and my family that I should make a disposition of
 the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me.
 I then find made this my last will and testament hereby
 recollecting and annulling all others heretofore made by me
 then first. I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
 and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances to
 and consistent with my soul I trust I shall return to God with
 God who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation through
 the blood of Jesus Christ whose religion
 I have professed and humbly hope I shall enjoy for
 many years.
 I then find I am and desire to my beloved wife
 Elizabeth Harris whom I have lived the strictest friend and love
 for more than fifty years. Lot of land number (190) over
 one hundred and ninety in the fourth district of original
 Henry (now Fulton County) containing two hundred and a half
 acres together with all my stock house hold and kitchen furniture
 and all my negroes during her natural lifetime and at her death
 I desire and direct that all of the above property shall be sold

Except the negroes, and the money equally divided among all my children
 Except my son hindrick which I desire to give him three hundred dollars
 more than the rest as I consider I owe him that much, for the purpose of
 Northey Negroes to gether I desire and direct that my son Joseph take them
 all at a fair valuation and divide the money Equally among them
 all my children having the right to obtain one eighth which is part of
 the slave Negroes

Item third I desire and direct at my death that the balance of my land, Lot
 number one hundred and ninety (190) containing one hundred and fifty two and
 half acres and lot number one hundred and ninety one containing two
 hundred two and a half acres be sold and the money Equally divided
 among all my children

Item fourth, I desire and direct that my son Joseph keep all the money and
 effects of my daughter Mary D. Culley part in his hands and pay her the
 interest on the same annually during her natural lifetime and to give
 her all the protection he can

Item fifth, I give and bequeath to my grand son Priest E. Hornsby two hundred
 dollars. Item sixth I. Can testify and appoint my son Joseph my Executor
 to this my last will and Testament this May the 25th 1858
