 and Christianlike manner suitable to my circumstances and condition
 my soul I trust shall return to rest with God in his Father's House
 for eternal salvation through the blood of our Saviour Jesus Christ

Item Second, I desire and direct that my debts be paid
 without delay by any Executors hereafter named or to be named
 my Creditors should be delayed of their rights, especially as there is
 no necessity for delay

Item Third, I desire to give to my Son Thomas M. Poole for his own use for
 ever lots of land Number Sixty, Sixty nine, Seventy, & Eighty one
 of the East part of Number twenty one, all lying and being in the
 fourteenth district of Originally Young now DeKalb County

Item fourth, I desire to give to my Son Allen J. Poole for his own use for
 ever lots of land Number One & Two in the fourteenth district of Originally
 Young now DeKalb County, And lot of land Number Eighteen in the
 fourteenth district of Originally Young now DeKalb County

to the County of DeKalb
 Item Fifth, I devise to my son Ephraim M Poole for his own use full
 lots of land near by thirty one, thirty three and thirty four in the four
 tenth district of Originally Henry Now DeKalb County.

Item Sixth, I bequeath to my daughter Margaret Rebecca Taliaferro
 my Negro Woman Jin about thirty three years old of dark complexion
 and all her Children, And Joseph a Boy about thirteen years old of
 dark complexion, to her and to her heirs forever

Item Seventh, I bequeath to my Grand daughter Margaret Rebecca
 Thrasher my Negro Woman Rachel about twenty five years old of dark
 complexion to her & her heirs forever

Item Eighth, I bequeath to my daughter Sarah Fournier and Children
 my Negro woman Tilly and all of the said Negro Children and all
 the increase she may have from this time

Item Ninth, I devise to my son in law Samuel S. Fournier one hundred
 and fifty Acres (more or less) being the East Side of Lot 1 Land Number
 Sixty Six in the fourth district of Originally Henry Now DeKalb County

Item Tenth, I devise and bequeath to me to wit Margaret
 Poole all the rest and residue of my property either real or personal
 every description not heretofore ^{already} disposed of for and during her
 Natural life to be controlled by her and my Executor and at her death
 my Will and desire is that the same be equally divided amongst
 all my Children except my daughter Betty Poole, she to have the
 hundred dollars less than the other Children I having given her
 that sumant before this and the thing that I want her to have
 daughter Sarah Fournier. My Will is for it to go to her Children
 and the share that goes to my daughter Margaret to have to be her
 life time and at her death to be divided among my said daughter
 Margaret Fournier, William Poole, and the share that I have pro-
 vided for her in another part of this Will

Item Eleventh, I constitute and appoint my three sons Thomas M
 Poole, Ephraim M Poole and John J. Poole Executors to this my last
 Will and Testament this 21st day of March 1852
