2nd I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my executor hereinafter appointed out of my
personal property if there be a sufficiency for this purpose
3rd After paying my debts as aforesaid I give bequeath & devise
to my beloved wife Gessie Carpenter all the residue of my
property both real & personal wherever & whatever it may be
with all the rights incidents & appurtenances do the same in any
wise belonging to her own proper use benefit & enjoyment forever
with full power to dispose of the same at any time previous or
by Will or deed at her death as she may think proper
4th I hereby constitute & appoint J. W. Thompson & Henry W. Daniel
County Executor of this Will & Testament

Per without having any Natural heir then and in that case his portion of my
estate (which is one eighth) is to count back to the surviving heirs of my

her body I give and bequeath one eighth part of my estate which
will be an equal share with the balance of my heirs one from the
Control of her husband John H. Redwine and to E. Asa Smith
Peacock daughter & heir of the body of my deceased daughter
Sarah Ann J. Peacock I bequeath one eighth part of my estate
and if the said E. Asa Smith should die without leaving any
heir of her body then and in that case his part of my estate
is to count back to the surviving heirs of my estate

And it is my will and desire that after my decease that
