and Claims in Action that I now own or may have or be entitled to at my death, I do give and bequeath to my Sister Charlotte Day with the exception of four hundred dollars which I will to my brother Seaton G Day Making them Legatees of my Estate I Nominate and Appoint my brother Seaton G Day Executor of this my last will & Testament published and declared as the last will and testimony of Caroline G Winship.
