Fulton County } I, Daniel Mithoff of the said State & County being of weak of body, but sound of mind, and knowing that life is uncertain and that death is certain, do not know and right that I should make a disposition of the property which a kind Providence has blessed me with, do therefore make this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

Item 1st I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my condition and circumstances in life, in that I trust will return to God who gave it

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executors herein after mentioned and appointed

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to the Rev. J. C. Smith for the use of the Catholic Church in Atlanta One hundred Dollars

Item 4th I wish and desire that my Executors will pay to the Reverend
 A. F. O'Neill for his own use and benefit Fifty dollars

Item 5th It is my wish and desire that Breely five dollars be paid
 to the Rev. A. F. O'Neill for the use of his School in Atlanta

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my kind friend Mrs. Mary Cannon
 Fifty dollars

Item 7th To my beloved sister Mary, I give, bequeath and devise
 the half of my Brick House on White Hall Street, known as the South
 half now occupied by A. Alexander, as a Store Store and Tailor Shop
 and also Office

Item 8th I also give and bequeath to me aforesaid sister Mary
 two lots lying and being in the City of Atlanta purchased of the Commis-
 sioner in the Green State containing Two Acres more or less

Item 9th To my beloved brother Isaac McShaffry I give and
 bequeath the North half of my Brick House on White Hall Street now
 occupied by A. Alexander as a Store and dwelling during
 his life and at his death, it is my wish and desire that his children
 shall have it share and share alike

Item 10th To my beloved brother William McShaffry I bequeath
 the house and lot on Jackson Street to him to him and his heirs the
 three lots lying and being in the City of Atlanta known as the lot
 purchased of Dr. Buchanan containing One and one half Acres
 more or less

Item 11th And in case my beloved brother William should die
 without heirs, then it is my wish and desire that my brother
 Owen and sister Mary shall have the whole of said house and lot

Item 12th I do hereby constitute and appoint John Lynch, David
 Wadsworth and George Warren Executors to the aforesaid will
 and testament
