fifty dollars, And my Son James H. Wright, is to receive  
one hundred and fifty dollars, And after all debts  
are paid the remainder to be divided equally  
And that my Son Hammett is to have the benefit of his  
share in the Loan Banking Association.

It is my desire that my Son in law Edmund C.  
Hammett do take Charge of and Manage the business  
as my Executor of this my last will August 10<sup>th</sup> 1861

State of Georgia I, Joseph Hays Head being of sound disposing  
Benton County mind and memory much advanced in life do  
make this my last will and testament revoking all others

I Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will and desire that my wife Sarah Head take all  
my estate both real and personal of what kind soever and that  
she pay all lawfull and just debts and claims that may be against  
me and that she enjoy the property I leave as she pleases and at her  
death to distribute among our children as she may think best and  
according to her pleasure

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I do not wish my wife to be at any expense in an administration  
and therefore it is my will that she take all my property  
and manage it as she likes either to suspend or divide it among  
our children or sell it and convey titles and use the funds as  
she pleases

I appoint my wife as the proper person to fulfill this my will  
In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this  
23<sup>rd</sup> day of April 1860
