

Child Perry, with all my furniture and the balance
furniture, also all my stock of every kind, with
my Buggy and other vehicles in the place, all the
above property I give to my wife Elizabeth during
her Natural lifetime or her widowhood, at the death
of either, the property to be sold and applied as
hereinafter described.

Article 2nd I give and bequeath to my grand
son William J Walker Four Hundred dollars
it being the portion allotted to his Mother my
Daughter Mary E Walker deceased, to be paid
unto him the said William when he arrives
at the age of twenty one year, provided the prop-
erty that I have given to my wife Elizabeth has been
brought to sale, if not to be paid at any future
time when sold.

Article 3rd I give and bequeath to my daugh-
ter Louisa J Wimberly Four hundred dollars
in money to make her equal with my older
children to be paid out of the first money col-
lected should there be any surplus after paying
the above legacy with any other debt or debts
that I now owe, I wish it equally divided among
all my children.

Article 4th My wish and desire is that after
the death of my wife the land I possess that I
have given to her in the first Article of this my
will, be sold and the money arising from the
sale then to be equally divided among all my
children, to wit, Malinda J Green, Elizabeth Mc-
Donough, William McDonough, Margaret E Sims,
James McDonough, Martha E Walker & my
Daughter Louisa J Wimberly.

Fifthly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
beloved wife Elizabeth McDonough and my sons
Elijah McDonough and William McDonough the
Executors of this my last will and testament, her-
ewith setting all other wills made by me
