Last Will and Testament of J. C. Orum
State of Georgia I J. C. Orum of the County and State
County of Fulton, aforesaid, do make, Publish and
declare my last Will and Testament as follows:
First, I charge my estate with Ten hundred and fifty
dollars or so much of that sum as may be necessary
to be applied in indemnifying George R. Hull for any
loss which he may sustain in the Capital invested by him in
the Atlanta Tannery, his investment is one thousand
dollars, and if he realizes that sum from his stock by
the combined means of sale, rent, and dividends, or
in any manner whatsoever, then he takes nothing from
my estate, but if after a fair sale of his stock, there remains
a deficiency in his principal (after adding to the
proceeds of sale all previous income from the stock)
then my Executor is directed to make up such deficiency
to him so far as the amount above set apart for
the purpose will extend. Loss Occasioned by fire is
not intended to be provided for in this bequest.
Second, I set apart Ten hundred & fifty dollars more
in order to place & return myself in the same footing
in a case exactly similar in all respects to the foregoing
Third, All my estate except what may be necessary
to carry out the two Wills above, I divide into seven
equal shares, and give them as follows forever
To My Mother Lucy Orum, One Share, and as a part
thereof, one hundred & forty one shares of stock in the
Nashville & Chattanooga Railroad, which I value
to her at seventeen hundred & thirty two dollars and
fifty cents (\$1742.50)
To William P. Orum, One Share, and as a part thereof
my stock in the Atlanta Tannery, which I value to him
at fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00)
To Francis H. Orum, One Share, and as a part thereof
One hundred shares of stock in the Nashville & Chattanooga
Railroad, which I value to him at twelve hundred
and fifty dollars (\$1250.00)
To Lewis H. Orum, One Share, and as a part thereof

the same amount of said stock at the same value (\$1250.00)
 To Jess. McCaffrey and Margaret Eliza Culp, his wife, One Share, And as a part thereof the same amount of said stock at the same value (\$1250.00)
 To Aquilla Orme, One Share, And as a part thereof thirty three shares of said Rail Road stock which I value to him at four hundred and fifty dollars (\$450.00)
 To Richard Orme, Such part of one share as may be covered by the debts against him which I may have on hand at my death, said debts are to be charged to him at what they cost me, and are to be estimated at the like sum in fixing the aggregate value of my estate.
 To William Orme in trust for the children of said Richard Orme the remaining fraction of a share, to be managed and expended by him for the benefit of said children, according to his own discretion.
Fourth As a matter of advice, I request three of my legates to whom I have given Rail Road stock, not to sell the same until after the Rail Road Company shall have declared a stock dividend, provided the event occurs within three years from my death.
Fifth I constitute and appoint my brother William P. Orme Executor, to see that my will is faithfully executed.
