Last Will and Testament of J C Orme

State of Georgia I J C Orme of the County and State  
County of Fulton Aforesaid do make publish and  
declare My last Will and Testament as follows:  
First. I charge my estate with Two hundred and fifty  
dollars or the Proportion of that sum as may be necessary  
to be applied in indemnifying George W. Hall for any  
loss which he may sustain in the Capital investment by him  
in the Atlanta Tannery His investment is one thousand  
dollars And if he realizes that sum from his stock by  
the combination of sale, rent, and dividends or  
in any manner whatsoever then he shall nothing from  
my estate, but if after a fair sale of his stock there remains  
a deficiency in his principal (after adding to the  
proceeds of sale all previous income from the stock)  
then my Executor is directed to make up such deficit  
out of him so far as the amount above set apart for  
the purpose will extend. Loss occasioned by fire is  
not intended to be provided for in this bequest  
Second. I set apart two hundred fifty dollars more  
in Order to place return to the same holding  
in a case exactly similar in all respects to the foregoing  
Third. All my estate except that may be necessary  
to carry out the two items above I divide into seven  
equal shares and give them as follows forever  
To my Mother Lucy Orme One share and as a part  
thereof one hundred Fifty one shares of Stock in the  
Nashville & Chattanooga Rail Road, which I value  
to her at seventeen hundred and thirty two dollars and  
fifty cents (\$1762.50)

To William Orme, One share, and as a part thereof  
my stock in the Atlanta Tannery, which I value to him  
at fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00)

To Francis J C Orme, One share, and as a part thereof  
One hundred shares of stock in the Nashville & Chatto-  
oga R R which I value to him at eleven hundred  
and fifty dollars (\$1250.00)

To Lewis H Orme, One share, and as a part thereof

the sum of One Thousand Dollars at the same value (\$1200)  
 To Jessie McGehee and Margaret Eliza Culpepper  
 his wife, Mrs. Shar, And as a part thereof the same amount  
 of said Stock at the same value (\$1250.00)  
 To Sophia J. Orme, Mrs. Shar And as a part thereof  
 thirty three shares of said Rail Road Stock which  
 I acknowledge to him at four hundred and fifty dollars  
 (\$450.00)

To Richard Orme, such part of one share as may be  
 covered by the debts against him which I may have  
 on hand at my death, Said debts are to be deducted to  
 him at what they cost me, And are to be estimated  
 at the like sum in fixing the aggregate value of my  
 estate.

To William P. Orme in trust for the Children of said  
 Richard Orme the remainder of fraction of a share, to  
 be managed and expended by him for the benefit  
 of said Children, According to his own discretion  
Fourthly As in all other cases, I request them of my  
 legatees to let him have given Rail Road Stock, not  
 to sell the same until after the Rail Road Company  
 shall have declared a stock dividend, Provided the  
 event occurs within three years from my death.  
Fifthly I constitute and appoint my brother William  
 P. Orme Executor, to see that my will is faithfully  
 executed
