I Jesse Clark of the County of Fulton & State of Georgia  
being of sound mind desposing of Mine and Memory And  
being desirous to settle my worldly Affairs while I have  
Strength so to do do make and publish this my last will  
and Testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any  
time heretofore made. And first I command my dearest God  
to have of me. And my body I desire to be buried in the  
family burial ground, where my worldly estate I dispose  
of as follows.

First, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Anna Clark  
choice of my house in the City of Atlanta or a partition with  
my youngest Child Anne bottom of lot. I also direct that  
at her option, she may take one third of my estate real  
and personal, or a choses part as she may see proper for  
her Maintenance from the time my youngest Child shall  
become of age, till her death, in that case the other two  
thirds of my estate chosen by my wife as aforesaid to be equally  
divided between my three Children if living or their heirs  
in equal shares.

Second, My property consisting of real estate in the City of  
Atlanta, I desire should be kept in good repair, And of  
thought best by my Executor, to further new buildings  
be put up, which it can be done by removing existing foundations  
one from the other after supporting the family, and repairing  
the houses as checked.

Third, If in the opinion of Mr. Executor it would be to  
the interest of my beloved family to sell a portion or all of my  
real estate, before my youngest Child becomes of age, I do direct  
that the same be sold by my Executor to do and make titled to the  
name of my two living sons after being married, so

Younger becomes of Age, then the Estate to be divided  
equal portion after my wife has taken out thirds of the  
stocks, but otherwise in equal part, which will be better  
to each.

Fifth, Upon My Youngest Son William F. Clark, becoming  
of Age, I will that My Executrix do sell all my Estates  
both Real and Personal, for the purpose of making a  
division, according to the tenor of this My last Will and

her My Executrix with Power to employ one or more persons

of My estate first of all paying her just debts
