My last will And Testament. Dated

Principally and first of all, I command my body  
to Almighty God who gave it And my body I  
do commit to the dust, to be buried in decent Chris-  
tian burial at the discretion of my Executors, And  
as touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has  
pleased God to bless me in this world, I give and  
disposo of the same in the following manner & form

Item the first, I give to my daughter Elizabeth  
McLean, the house and lot on which she now  
lives, being lots purchased from John Rogers in  
the City of Rome, the same on which I made the  
improvements occupied by me till I removed to  
Atlanta together with all my Household and  
Kitchen furniture, including beds, Boxes, tools  
also one Negro woman Madeline Marcell, one Negro  
boy named Henry, and as to all certain claims  
which I have on the Government, now in the hands  
of General McDonald for collection upon the terms  
that he is to collect for William J. Burns, and the  
heirs of Stockwood, after deducting therefrom the  
amount which will be due to General McDonald  
for his services, and also a sum of Three Hundred  
of a large amount not capable to collect the said  
to Dr Banks, I give and bequeath in equal portions  
to all my children that are living, due to the children  
of my daughter Nancy S. Utterwood, due to the children  
of my said deceased daughter, the proportion that  
should have fallen to her if she was in life, and  
also as the collection of these claims unto her if she  
should be so far as to receive and collect the same,  
I advise shall have the third of all that may be col-  
lected, and all other claims, and demands due to the  
time of my death, I leave to be equally divided bet-  
ween my three sons, James R., Gideon P. & John Utter-  
wood, And before my Executors
