 of sound Mind And Memory, Calling to Mind
 the Mortality of my body, And knowing that it is
 appointed of all Men Once to die, do make this
 my last Will And testament. Viz

Principally And first of all, I recommend my Soul
 to Almighty God Who gave it, And my body I
 commend to the dust, to be buried in decent Chris-
 tian burial at the discretion of my Executors, And
 as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it has
 pleased God to bless me in this world, I give And
 dispose of the same in the following manner & form

Item the first, I give to my daughter Elizabeth
 Wilson, the Houses and lot on which she now
 lives, being lots purchased from John Rogers in
 the City of Rome. The same on which I made the
 improvements Occupied by me till I removed to
 Atlanta together with all my Household and
 Kitchen furniture, including beds & boxsteads
 also One Negro woman named Mariah, One Negro
 Boy named Henry, And as to all certain Claims
 which I have on the Government, now in the hands
 of Governor McDonald for Collection, upon the terms
 that he is to Collect for William H. Underwood, and the
 heirs of William H. Underwood, and the
 Amount which will be due to Governor McDonald
 for his services, And also a claim on the Trust
 of a large Amount not exactly recollectible paid
 to Dr Banks, I give and bequeath in equal portions
 to all my Children that are living, And to the Children
 of my daughter Nancy Underwood who is dead, to my
 Children in equal proportions, as to the Children
 of my said deceased daughter, the portions that
 would have fallen to her if she was in life, and
 also as the Collection of these Claims will be of much
 trouble to John W. Underwood if Collectors, who he
 fully Authorizes to receive and Collect the same,
 I desire shall have one third of all that may be Col-
 lected And all other Claims And Monies I have at the
 time of my death, I leave to be equally divided be-
 tween my three Sons, James R. Gaston M. & John whom
 I constitute And appoint my Executors
 In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my

County aforesaid, being of sound mind and disposing
memory, do make this my last will and testament
After my death I desire that my body be decently
buried without any parade or obsequies, and my
soul I commit to the hands of a faithful God trusting
for its salvation in the all powerful merits of our
Lord Jesus Christ

Article 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Donohue the following lots of land
to wit Lot No 25 and part of Lot No 26 in the
14th district (fourteenth District) of originally Tazewell
but now in the County of Fulton the place to which
on I now live, I also give and bequeath to my wife
Elizabeth & Negro Man by the Name of An
a Negro woman by the Name of Harriet an
